In the last years she has performed as a soloist all over Europe with various groups and conductors such as Il concerto Viennese, Ensemble Fioretto, the Vienna Bachsolists, Le Cercle de L'Harmonie, Capella Leopoldina, "L'Ensemble Baroque de Limoges" and "L'Ensemble Orchestre de Basse Normandie", Jérémie Rhorer, Christoph Coin, Michi Gaigg, Martin Haselböck and the Wiener Akademie.
